DiverseWorks ArtSpace announces Rachel Cook as new Assistant Curator

(Houston, TX, July 30, 2012) –DiverseWorks ArtSpace is pleased to announce the appointment of Rachel Cook to the newly-created post of Assistant Curator. Cook will coordinate the production of exhibitions, performances, and public programs and work closely with a reinvigorated Artist Board.

DiverseWorks Executive Director Elizabeth Dunbar states: "With her wealth of curatorial experience, enthusiasm for working with artists, and commitment to testing new ideas in the public arena, Rachel will be a tremendous asset to Houston and the DiverseWorks team. I am thrilled to welcome her back to Texas, and to DiverseWorks, where she started her curatorial career."

A Houston native, Cook is a curator and writer. As a guest curator, she organized "Now that I am by myself," she says, "I'm not by myself, which is good," for DiverseWorks in 2009. Recent curatorial projects include Undetectable (Visual AIDS, La Mama Galleria, NYC), Not-Not-Not Images-Objects (Meulensteen, NYC), and Three Evidentiary Claims (CCS Bard, Annandale-on-Hudson). She has previously worked for dOCUMENTA (13)'s publication team, and most recently as a summer fellow for the International Studio & Curatorial Program. Prior to her time in the northeast, Cook was Editor of Glasstire; External Affairs Manager for Art Lies, a contemporary art quarterly; and a Public Relations Consultant for the Visual Arts Center (VAC) and the Department of Art and Art History at The University of Texas at Austin. Cook holds a MA from the Center for Curatorial Studies at Bard College and a BFA from the San Francisco Art Institute.

She begins her position at DiverseWorks on August 20, 2012.
